Purpose

The goal of the Sexual Violence Prevalence (SVP) Survey is to evaluate the climate experienced by students and employees at SUNY campuses regarding sexual violence. The 2024-25 SVP is the fifth System-wide administration of this survey following its initial administration in 2016-17.

Per State Education Law §129-B and SUNY Board of Trustees policy, all SUNY campuses are required to administer an SVP Campus Climate Survey at least every other year. The present summary reports on the most recent results of this mandate, utilizing controls to protect the privacy of survey participants. The survey addresses student and employee knowledge about:

- campus policies and procedures addressing sexual assault;
- how and where to report sexual violence as a victim/survivor or witness;
- the Title IX Coordinator's role;
- the availability of resources on and off campus, such as counseling, health, academic assistance;
- the general awareness of the definition of affirmative consent; and
- the general awareness of the difference, if any, between their institution's policies and the penal law.

Further, the survey asks respondents about their experiences with:

- the prevalence of victimization and perpetration of sexual harassment, sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking on and off campus during a set time period;
- bystander attitudes and behavior; and
- whether reporting individuals disclosed to the college/university and/or police, and reasons why they did or did not report.

Climate assessments afford institutions the opportunity to better understand their campus and to make informed decisions when it comes to providing a safe educational environment. Individual participation in the 2025 SVP was voluntary and the responses to survey questions are not disclosed or used to make any judgments concerning individuals.

Study Population

The SVP study population included:

- Undergraduate and graduate home institution¹ students 18 years of age² and older who were enrolled in at least one class for credit at the surveying institution during the Spring 2025 semester. All high school students and

¹ Home institution students include those with an admission status of regular admit, active EOP, inactive EOP, other special admit, and non-degree seeking students (excludes continuing education, cross-registered college in high school, and auditors, among others).

² The age criterion was calculated as of the first date of the survey administration, which occurred during a three-week period selected by each campus in Spring 2025.

incarcerated individuals were excluded.

- All faculty/staff 18 years of age and older employed at the surveying campus in Spring 2025.

Campus Comparisons

For purposes of this analysis, Fashion Institute of Technology (FIT) is included in Technology Colleges. The remaining community colleges are categorized as small, medium, or large based on a periodic review of matriculated enrollment: small campuses enroll 1,500 or fewer students, medium campuses enroll between 1,500 and 4,000, and large campuses enroll more than 4,000 students.

Response Rates




The tables below display overall response rates for the 2023 and 2025 administration of the SVP student survey. The student response rate decreased by 1.5 percentage points, from 6.4% in 2023 to 4.9% in 2025. A decrease occurred across all sub-sectors.

Overall student response rates have decreased since the 2019 and 2021 administrations of the SVP, across both four-year and two-year campuses.

The response rate also decreased for employees, from 25.9% in 2023 to 18.1% in 2025. This decrease occurred across all sub-sectors.

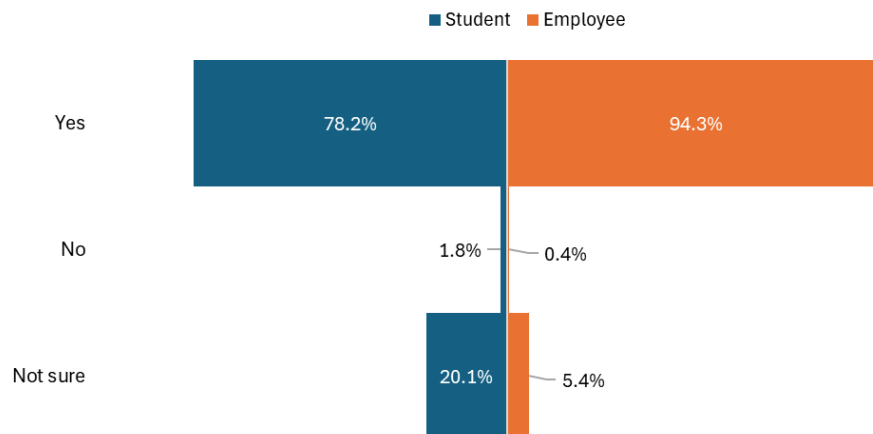

Policy Awareness

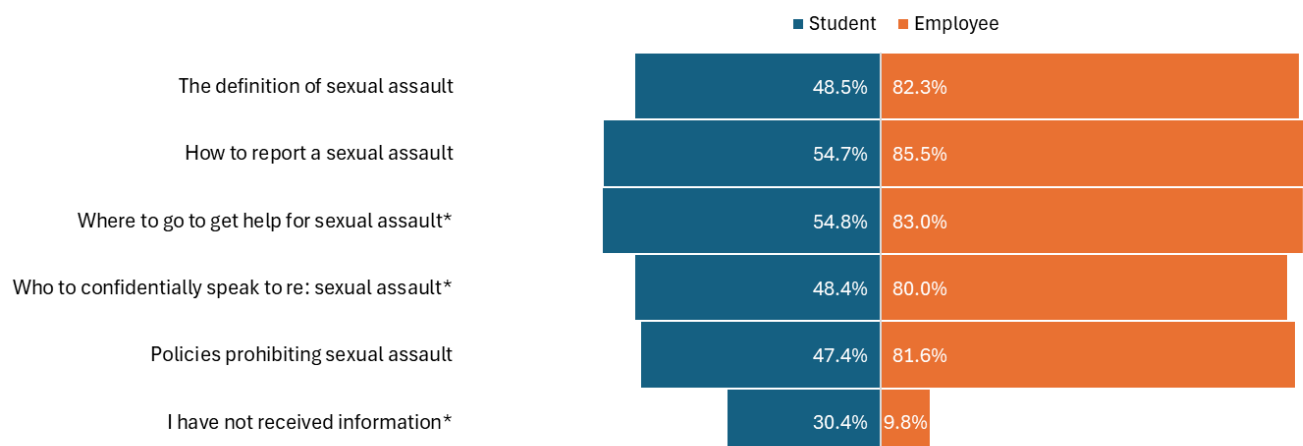
In 2025, a higher percentage of employees agreed that their “campus has policies and procedures specifically addressing sexual assault,” with 94.3% of employees responding yes compared to 78.2% of students. While 20.1% of students were unsure of policies, only 5.4% of employees were.

Compared to students, a higher percentage of employees also indicated they had received written and/or verbal information about the definition of sexual assault, how to report a sexual assault, where to go to get help for sexual assault, who to confidentially speak to about sexual assault, and policies prohibiting sexual assault. A total of 30.4% of students reported not having received information compared to 9.8% of employees. Additionally, employee knowledge of how to advise a student on where to get help on campus has risen from 84.4% in 2023 to 86.2% in 2025.

Since 2019, there has been an increase in the percentage of students reporting knowledge of how to find the Title IX Coordinator (+17 percentage points). The percent of students with knowledge of how to report sexual assault (-3 percentage points), sexual harassment (-2 percentage points), stalking (-2 percentage points), and domestic/dating violence (+2 percentage points) has not substantially changed.

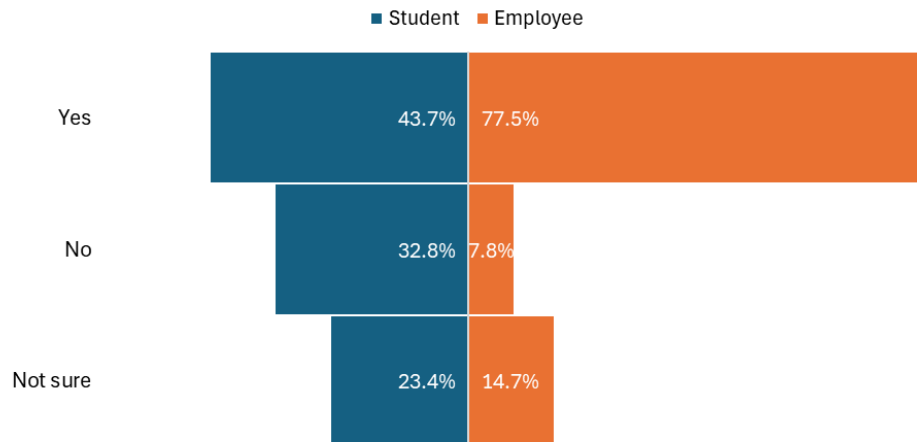

Title IX Coordinator

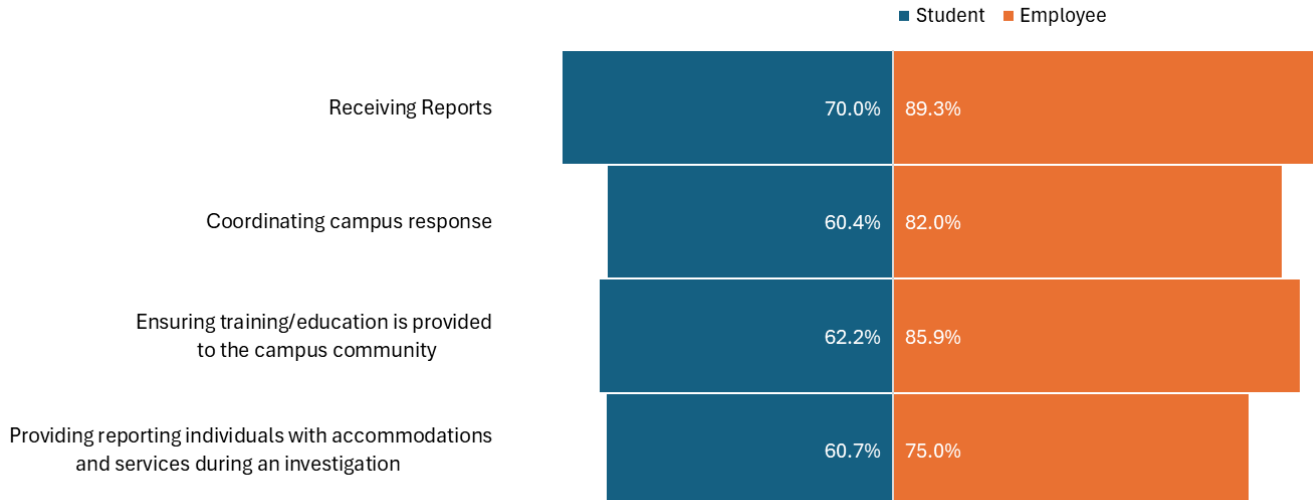
Over half of 2025 student respondents either did not know (32.8%) or were not sure (23.4%) how to contact the Title IX Coordinator, whereas 77.5% of employee respondents indicated they know how to contact the Title IX Coordinator.

For both students and employees, most respondents reported knowing that the Title IX Coordinator’s role regarding sex discrimination/sexual assault/sexual misconduct includes receiving reports, coordinating campus response, ensuring training/education is provided to the campus community, and providing reporting individuals with accommodations and services during an investigation.

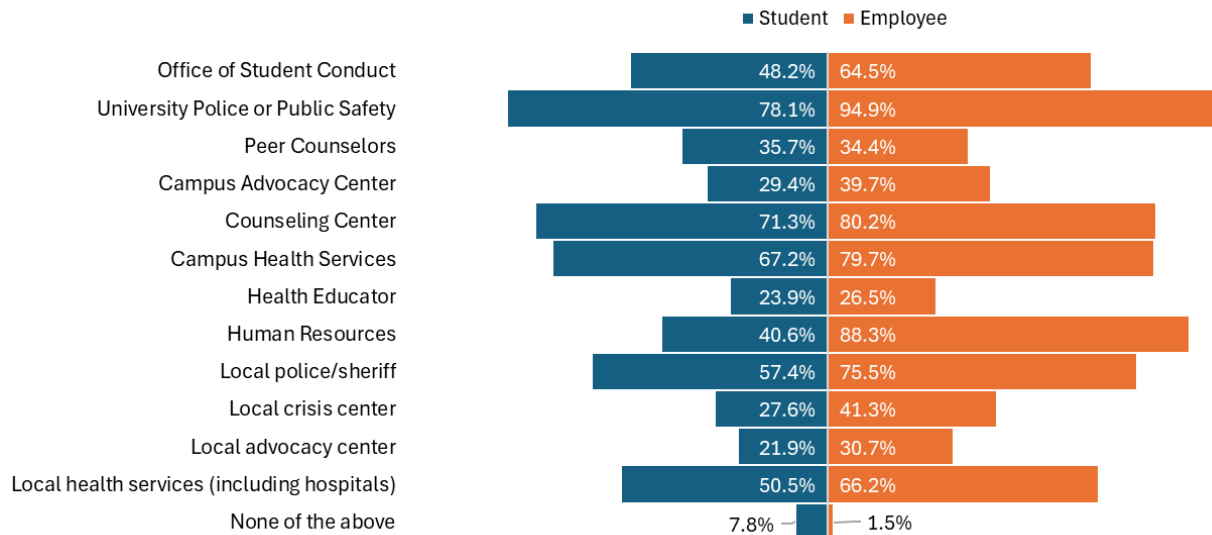
Which are the roles of a Title IX Coordinator in regards to sex discrimination/sexual assault/sexual misconduct? (Yes responses)



Resources

At least 50% of both students and employees reported knowing about the following on-campus and community resources: University Police, the counseling center, campus health services, local police, and local health services, including hospitals. Less than 50% of students and employees knew about peer counselors, the campus advocacy center, health educators, local crisis centers, or local advocacy centers.

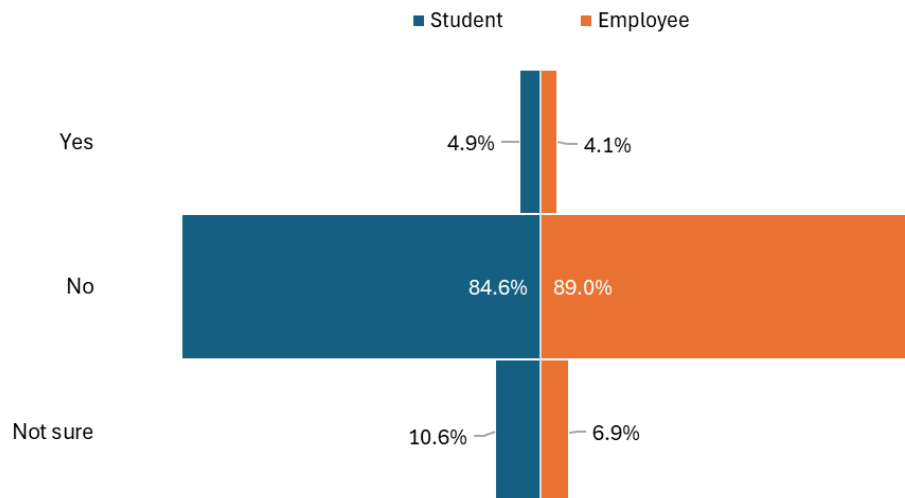
Please indicate your awareness of the following on-campus and community resources:

Affirmative Consent

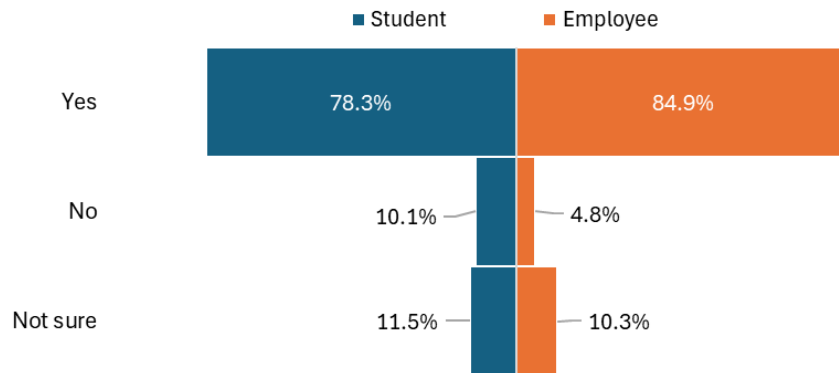
When asked whether someone who is incapacitated can provide consent, 84.6% of students and 89.0% of employees responded with no, while 10.6% of students and 6.9% of employees were not sure.

Additionally, 78.3% of students and over 84.9% of employees reported knowing the definition of affirmative consent.

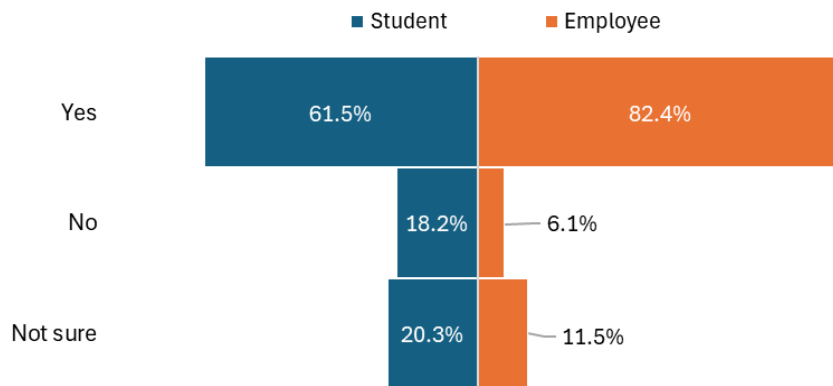
Do you know the definition of Affirmative Consent?



Institution Policy Compared to Penal Law

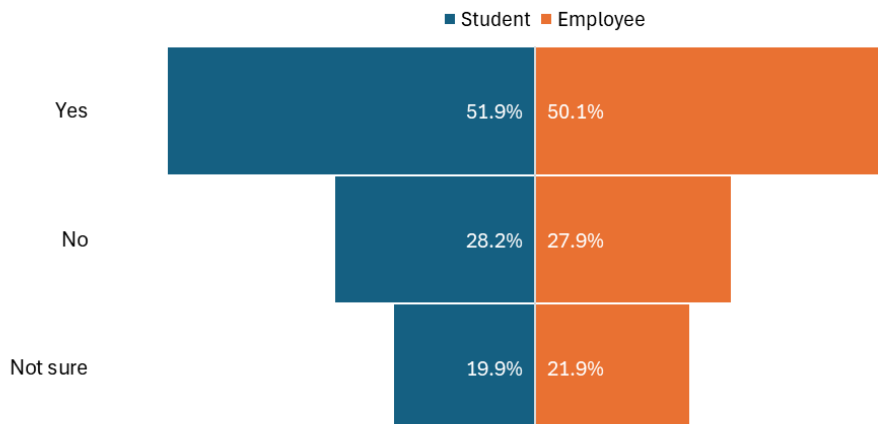
Most students (61.5%) and employees (82.4%) reported knowing the difference between the college disciplinary process and the criminal justice system.

Only half of employees and 51.9% of students reported knowing about SUNY's alcohol and/or drug use amnesty policy in reporting sexual violence.

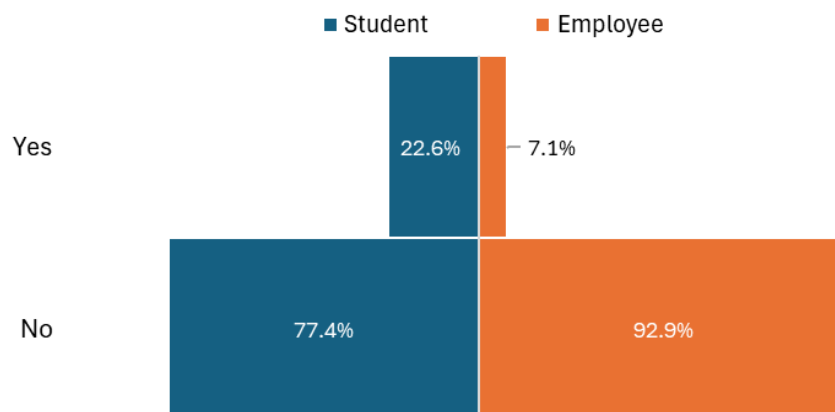
Do you know about SUNY's alcohol and/or drug use amnesty policy in reporting sexual violence?



Sexual Harassment³

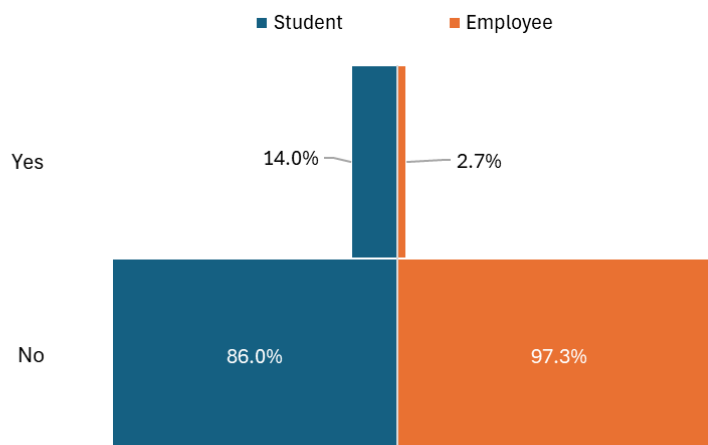
Within the last year, 22.6% of student respondents and 7.1% of employee respondents indicated that they experienced unwanted sexual comments, sexual slurs, or demeaning jokes.

During the same time period, 14.0% of student respondents and 2.7% of employee respondents indicated that they experienced unwanted sexually suggestive digital communications, either words or images or both, including emails, texts, social media communications, or in letters or other written communications.

During the last year, have you received unwanted sexually suggestive digital communications, either words or images or both, including emails, texts, social media communications, or in letters or other written communications?








³ Sexual harassment includes the following experiences as described in the survey instrument:

- Unwanted sexual comments, sexual slurs, or demeaning jokes;
- Being aware of someone viewing your sexual activity or nakedness without consent or taking explicit pictures or recordings without your consent;
- Receiving unwanted sexually suggestive digital communications, either words or images or both, including emails, texts, social media communications, or in letters or other written communications.

Sexual Harassment, Sexual Assault⁴, Rape⁵, Stalking, and Formal Reporting

Over the past six years, there have been slight decreases in the percent of students responding that they have experienced sexual harassment (-6 percentage points) and sexual assault (-4 percentage points), but the percent reporting rape has not changed and those reporting stalking has also stayed about the same (-1 percentage points). Additionally, there has been a 6-point increase in the number of students responding that they reported an incident via a formal process.

Sexual Harassment by Demographic Attributes

Students who reported identifying within marginalized gender identities or sexual orientations reported higher levels of experiencing sexual harassment. Among race/ethnicity groups, marginalized students have varying experiences. To illustrate, the following graphs show the percent of students of each gender identity, sexual orientation, and race/ethnicity who reported experiencing sexual harassment. Statistical analysis was done to test the significance of these varying percentages.

Gender Identity

Men reported experiencing significantly less harassment than all other gender identity groups at 10.0%. Women experienced significantly more harassment than men at 29.2%, but significantly less harassment than non-binary (51.2%), transgender (41.8%), and genderqueer/gender-fluid students (49.0%).

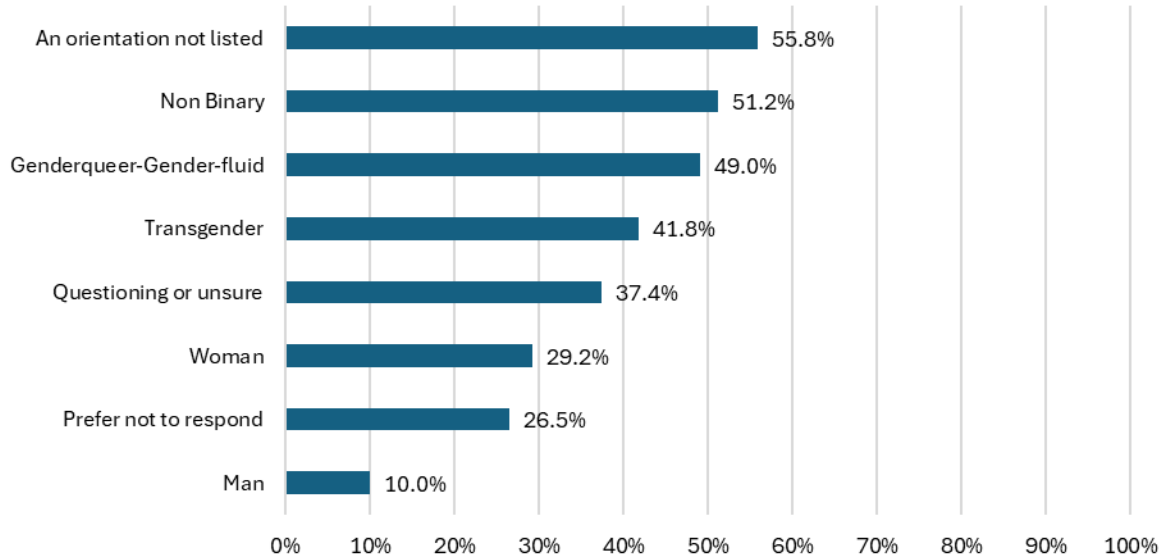

- Someone attempting, but not completing, or completing the following:
 - Fondling, kissing, or rubbing up against the private areas of your body without consent;
 - Removing your clothes without consent.
- Someone attempting, but not completing, the following:
 - Performing oral sex or forcing you to perform oral sex without consent,
 - Sexually penetrating you or forcing you to penetrate without consent.

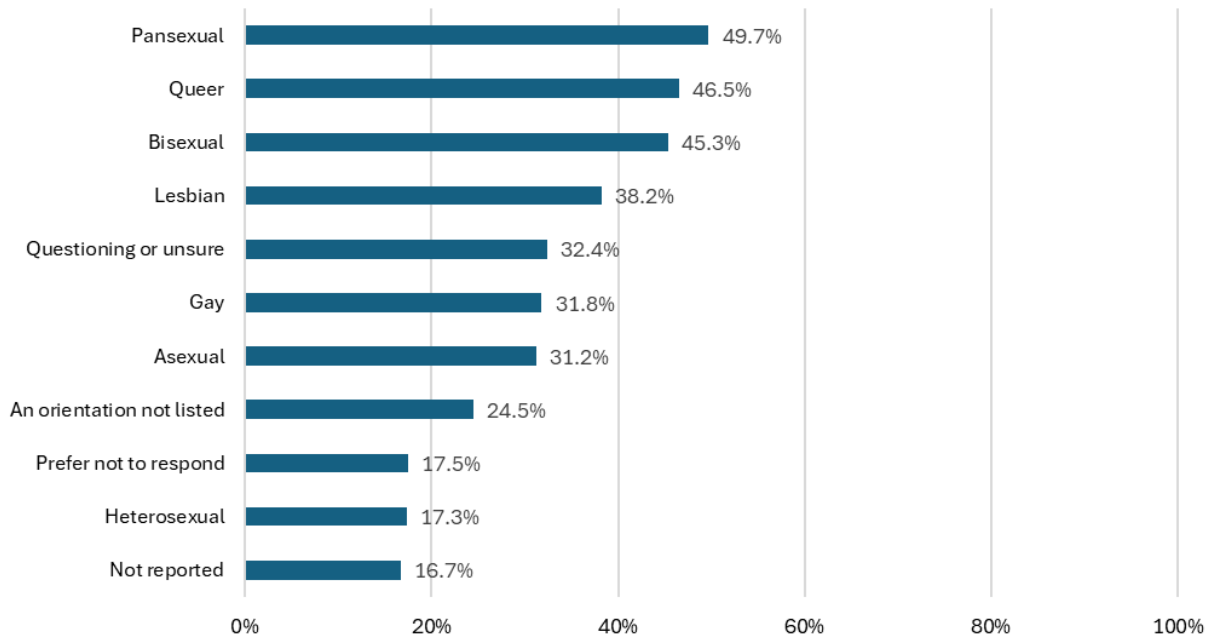
Percent of Students of Each Gender Identity Who Reported Experiencing Sexual Harassment



Sexual Orientation

All other sexual orientations reported experiencing significantly more harassment than heterosexual students (17.3%). Within those other orientations, bisexual (45.3%), pansexual (49.7%), and queer (46.5%) students reported significantly more harassment than the remaining orientations.

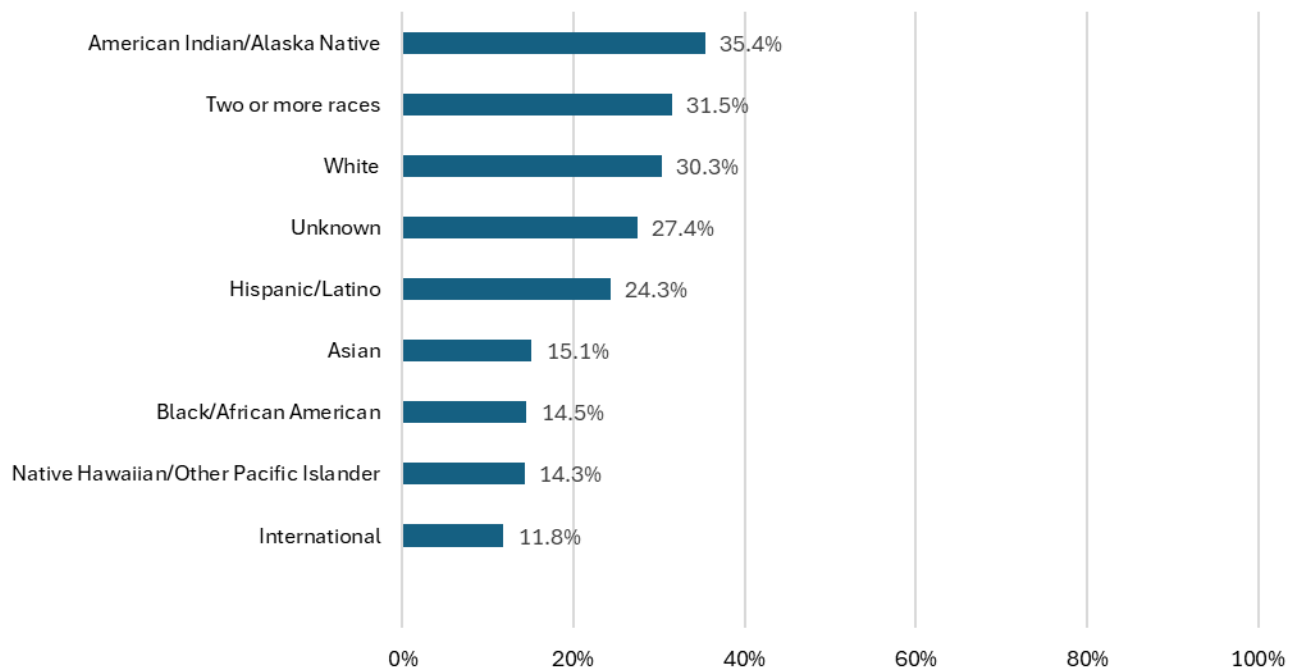
Percent of Students of Each Sexual Orientation Who Reported Experiencing Sexual Harassment



Race/Ethnicity

American Indian or Alaska Native (35.4%), White (30.3%), two or more races (31.5%), and unknown race/ethnicity (27.4%) students reported significantly more harassment than Asian (15.1%), Black or African American (14.5%), and International (11.8%) students.






Percent of Students of Each Race/Ethnicity Who Reported Experiencing Sexual Harassment



Bystander Attitudes

Since 2019, students have reported decreasing levels of peer likelihood to: get help/resources for a friend who was assaulted (-9 percentage points); call for help if they heard a neighbor calling for help (-12 percentage points); confront a friend who told them they had sex with someone who was passed out or who did not give consent (-8 percentage points); tell an RA or campus authority information that might help in an assault case, even when pressured by friends to stay silent (-7 percentage points); and express discomfort if someone made a joke about a person's body (-1 percentage points).

Key Takeaways

- Despite decreased response rates compared to prior years, more than 14,000 students and 14,000 employees across SUNY responded to the 2025 SVP survey.
- The proportion of respondents who indicated knowledge of campus policies increased from 2023 to 2025.
 - Compared to 2023, there was an increase the proportion of students who know about campus policies and procedures, how to find the Title IX Coordinator, and how report sexual assault, sexual harassment, domestic violence/dating violence, and stalking.
 - Similarly, there was an increase in employee knowledge. A greater proportion of employees indicated that they know how to advise a student on where to go for help on campus and that they understand what happens at their campus when a student reports sexual assault.
- The percentage of students who reported experiencing sexual harassment and sexual assault has declined since 2019; students who reported experiencing rape or stalking has remained unchanged.
- The percentage of student who reported their most recent experience through a formal process increased to 17% in 2025, up from 2019.
- A significantly higher proportion of students identifying within marginalized gender identities and sexual orientations reported experiencing sexual harassment compared to survey respondents overall.
